1. Policy Bootcamp in the Fall in Washington D.C.

- o Projected budget: \$40,000.00
- o The Law and Policy TAC will convene a quantum policy boot camp in Washington, D.C.
 - The boot camp will allow participants from the quantum business or research sectors to learn about quantum policy issues and the federal policy-making process.
 - This boot camp may be held in the same week as the tech showcase on the Hill, which was aimed at the policymaker audience in DC. The tech showcase of 2024 was a huge success, and we heard from many of our members that they would like it to be held again.

 - The subcommittees will elect their leaders and determine their work plans for 2025.
 - The subcommittee leaders will send monthly minutes of subcommittee meetings to the Chair and Co-Chair of the Law and Policy TAC, and the Chair and Co-Chair of the Law and Policy TAC will combine and distribute the monthly minutes of the subcommittees to the full Law and Policy TAC to inform their members of what each subcommittee is working on.
 - The subcommittees will have a standing slot on the Law and Policy TACs agenda for their quarterly business meeting so that their leaders can brief the members at large on their work for the preceding quarter.
 - **POLICY SUBCOMMITTEE** The chairs of the Law and Policy TAC, in partnership with QED-C leadership, may periodically organize ad hoc working groups to study and, as necessary, develop written educational resources to inform regulatory policies that affect the quantum business or research sectors.

How Law and Policy TAC's Budget Breakdown

The Law and Policy TAC expects to spend most of its \$50,000.00 budget request on holding a Policy boot camp in Washington, D.C., sometime in the Fall. The Boot camp will allow participants from the quantum business or research sectors to learn about quantum policy issues and the federal policy-making process. This is highlighted in the red squares and meets the QED-C's goals for their 3-5 year strategic planning by developing and implementing a comprehensive communication strategy, amplifying the collective knowledge of the quantum community, enhancing QED-C's position as an industry thought leader, develop and implement a comprehensive government relations strategy, strengthening the global member community by allowing those from near and far to participate in the bootcamp, and will evolve the QED-C to best serve its members by showcasing the current issues the quantum community is facing and how the federal policy-making pro works.

The remainder of the Law and Policy TAC expects to spend money on the monthly speaker series. The monthly speaker series will include law and/or policy experts on topics relevant to the quantum business and research sector. These sessions will be recorded and made available to QED-C's broader membership. Potential topics include U.S. and allied export controls, anticipated trends in U.S. immigration policy, recent patent law and policy developments, U.S. – China relations, the EU Draghi Report, U.S. industrial policy, and geopolitics of the critical minerals supply chain. This is highlighted in the orange squares and meets the QED-C's goals for their 3–5-year strategic planning by developing and implementing a comprehensive communication strategy, enhancing QED-C's position as an industry thought leader, help shape international quantum policy development and implementation, strengthening the global member Community, and evolve the QED-C to serve its members best.

Should the whitepapers or policy papers that the QED-C Law and Policy TAC work on require outside assistance to create or publish, the Law and Policy TAC can and should hold back some of the speaker's money for this. This is highlighted in the green squares and meets the QED-C's goals for their 3–5-year strategic planning by developing and implementing a comprehensive communication strategy, amplifying the collective knowledge of the quantum community, enhancing QED-C's position as an industry thought leader, foster opportunities for members, develop and implement a comprehensive government relations strategy, help shape international quantum policy development and implementation, enhance the global member engagement, value and delivery, it will also evolve the QED-C to serve its members best.

While the above explains how the Law and Policy TACs budget will be utilized, the remaining topics should not be ignored. The Law and Policy TAC also hopes to put another day of CLEs at the November Plenary, as last year's CLEs were successful. This will help achieve the QED-C's goals for their 3-5 year strategic planning by enhancing QED-C's position as an industry thought leader, diversifying QED-C's revenue stream since people pay for CLEs, and will help the QED-C evolve the QED-C to serve its members best by offering CLEs based on quantum topics, it will keep the legal community apprised of what is occurring within the quantum realm. Our subcommittees (IP, Policy, and Ethics) will also accomplish the QED-Cs 3–5-year strategic planning by developing and implementing a comprehensive communication strategy, enhancing QED-C's position as an industry thought leader, foster opportunities for members, help shape international quantum policy development and implementation, strengthening the global member Community, and evolve the QED-C to serve its members best. Additionally, when the QED-C spins out into its own 501(c)(3), the Law and Policy TAC believes that the QED-C should partner with the Quantum Industry Coalition ("QIC") led by Paul Stimers to lobby on behalf of the QED-C

C and its members. This would assist in accomplishing the QED-C's 3-5 year strategic plan because it will enhance the QED-C's position as an industry thought leader, foster opportunities for members, develop and implement a comprehensive government relations strategy, help shape international quantum policy development and implementation, enhance the global member engagement, value and delivery, it will also evolve the QED-C to serve its members best.
